Frequently Asked Questions

Can I reserve a campsite?

Yes! Reservations can be taken 10 days or more in advance. Week-end reservations require a two day minimum stay. All camping reservations are charged a \$10.00 non-refundable fee.

To make a reservation please call the Park District office at 206-842-2306 between the hours of 8:30 and 5:00, Monday through Friday.

Where do I pay?

Pay for your stay at the auto-pay station by the south restrooms. The pay station takes credit/debit cards or exact change cash. Please clip the ticket to the post at your campsite.

Is there a discount for bikers and hikers?

Yes. Bikers, hikers and kayakers pay \$7 each per night per person for beach campsites.

What is the 2:30 PM check-in time?

If a campsite is vacant and not reserved for the evening, you may pay for it when you arrive. During peak season the previous night's camper's check-out is 1 PM. Please pay and post your ticket within an hour of setting up so we can track which sites are taken.

Is there a limit to the length of stay here?

Yes. You can stay up to 10 days in a 30 day period

Can I get firewood?

Yes. The camp hosts have firewood at Site 18 for six dollars a bucket. Pay for the firewood at the pay station and give the ticket to the camp host.

Please empty the bucket and bring it back so we can refill it for the next camper.

The toilet paper or soap is out. Who do I talk to?

This shouldn't happen but if it does tell the camp host or staff right away so we can re-stock.

Where are the volleyball and horseshoes?

They should be out on the field. If they are not, see the camp host.

Is there a lost and found?

Yes, initially items are generally turned into the camp hosts and eventually go to the park office at Strawberry Hill/206-842-2306

Park Rules

1. Quiet time is between 10 pm and 6:30 am Enforced by Bainbridge Island Police.
2. Display your paid ticket on the post associated with your campsite.
3. Maximum number of campers per site is 8.
4. No Fires on the Beach. Do not gather driftwood or other park wood for fires.
5. If no kayakers arrive to stay at the designated kayak campsite by 6 PM, that site is becomes open to any camper.
6. There is a 10 night camping limit in a 30 day period
7. One car per campsite is included with the overnight fee. Tickets for each extra vehicle are \$10 / night and are also purchased at the pay station and clipped to the post associated with your campsite.
8. Dogs are welcome, but please keep them on a leash and remember to pick up after them.
9. Please stay on main trails to protect wildlife habitat and the fragile backbeach area.
10. There are no fireworks allowed in any of our parks.
11. Generators may be used between 8am and 9pm
12. For emergencies please call 911
13. Please respect your fellow campers. Quiet music and voices are what keep people coming back. Please enjoy your stay!
